Design Review:

- 900 E Fort has started demolition. Bus stop will apparently be gone for 2 years. Will look into whether MTA can do temporary stop.
- 1624 Clement St permitting issues project was fined several thousand dollars and issued stop work order. Contractor has paid fines & is moving forward.
- Latrobe Field House minor change, doors moved from rear to front of building for ease of patrol. Construction document completion on track for June, starting construction in July.
- Question: Have we thought about buy-a-brick program as fundraiser for park? Will keep in mind as Field House moves forward.
